Instantly I began to view life from a different perspective: the perspective of the kingdom.


I have been consumed with a passion for God: to know Him, to be with Him, to serve Him.

It is He who crushed the devil at Calvary and is, even now, orchestrating my life and healing for His glory—using means and people I do not control.

Faith has come. Faith in God. Faith in His nature. Faith He wants me here for a reason: to wander around heaven, then return as His conduit, His oracle. To speak and write His words-only.

I've been convicted of a judgmental spirit. I was like Charlie Brown, who once said, "I take my religion seriously. I get into arguments almost every day." Many whom I have judged have been the first ones God sent to pray for me.



My prayer is that I would become as a little child. Children do not hold grudges. They do not judge others, and if they do, they forget it moments later as they return to playing together. Children give
