He has served as pastor of the West Angeles Church of God in Christ since January 8, 1969, where he started with a 50-member congregation. Today the church has more than 9,000 active members. Blake's Los Angeles-area "neighbor," Jack Hayford, along with many pastors and leaders across the country, recognizes Blake as a man of integrity and strength with an important message for the body of Christ at large.

There is a strong tie between the issues raised in our feature articles and those raised in Blake's inaugural column. After all, how can we talk about unity across denominational lines unless we speak with similar urgency about unity and understanding across racial lines?

Even if denominational walls were to come down tomorrow, Sunday morning still would be "the most segregated hour in America." In this issue, Blake raises questions and concerns that all Christian leaders, black and white, must address with integrity and determination and with faith in the God who, through Christ, made us "neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free."

Race is a wall that divides our culture. But the church is not intended to reflect the culture; it is, in its essence, counterculture. We must show the world a better way.
