Sailing Priest Set To Speak

EAU GALLIE — David H. K. Stiles, Anglican (Episcopalian) priest from Toronto, Canada, will speak at all services at the Baptist Tabernacle in Eau Gallie Sunday.

Fr. Stiles was an engineer in a Canadian aircraft manufacturing firm before he felt called to train for and serve in the Anglican priesthood. After graduation from Wycliffe College, University of Toronto, he was ordained in the Diocese of Toronto in 1956 and served in three parishes, his last charge being in the city of Toronto.

IN 1963, while Fr. Stiles was the rector of a quiet Canadian parish, his life was radically changed through the Scriptural phenomenom known as the Baptism with the Holy Spirit. Suddently his ministry came alive and for the next three years his church witnessed many conversions, healings and miracles through the min-

istry of this Spirit-filled priest.

In 1966, Fr. Stiles resigned his parish ministry and purchased a 100 ton vacht which he renamed the "Agape." Sailing his ship down the intercoastal waterway he has established a marine mission to Southern waters with his home base in Bradenton. From there he sails his ship on missionary voyages in the Gulf of Mexico and to the islands of the Caribbean with Christian lay people aboard as crewmissionaries. He and his wife and three children live aboard the ship while it is moored in port.

Fr. Stiles has been called on to speak at various interdenominational fellowships and is recognized as an authority on spiritual healing.
