

Brevard Author Has Tenth Book Published

"Shout It From The Houseltops" by Pat Robertson With Jamie Buckingham — Logos Publishers.

"Shout It From The Houseltops" is a recently published book by Pat Robertson co-authored by Brevard County writer Jamie Buckingham which describes in dramatic detail the founding of the Christian Broadcasting Network.

But more than that, "Houseltops" is the story of a successful American business man who literally sold all he had — furniture, paintings, everything but his wife's silver and their old car — to obey an impression he received from God.

Thus Pat Robertson stepped out in faith, believing that with God as his boss he could not fail.

He felt called to evangelize the world through television and radio.

The ups and downs of that dream unfold through the pages of "Shout It From the Houseltops."

During the long months Pat subsisted on soy beans, lived in near poverty he clung to the promises of God with joy.

At one time in his life Pat had

everything going for him. He was Mr. Success by standards of most modern men. He had an illustrious family heritage as the son of a U. S. Senator from Virginia. Pat had achieved a reputation of his own as a golden gloves boxer, as holder of Phi Beta Kappa key from Washington and Lee, and as a Marine combat officer in Korea, as a law graduate from Yale.

And he had been a partner in a successful electronic component business.

But life seemed empty. He was a treadmill and he wanted to jump off. But how?

As he read Luke 12:33, "... Sell all that you have and give alm. .," he obeyed.

The journey was not easy. But from \$70 began a walk in faith which ended up with a multi-million dollar broadcasting company, beaming the message of Christ into homes across the nation and indeed into other continents.

This is an unforgettable reading experience about one man who enjoys both the fulfillment of a dream sometimes and gets trapped into

some despairing moments.

The book was whipped into shape by a professional writer, Jamie Buckingham, a pastor, author of note and roving editor for Norman Vincent Peale's "Guildepasts" magazine. He was educated at Mercer University and Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary.

As a professional writer he has traveled the world, including a trek behind the Iron Curtain with a team of Bible smugglers under the supervision of a Dutchman known as Brother Andrew.

His ten books include such well known titles as "Run Baby Run" a two-million copy best-seller about Nicky Cruz now being made into a motion picture.

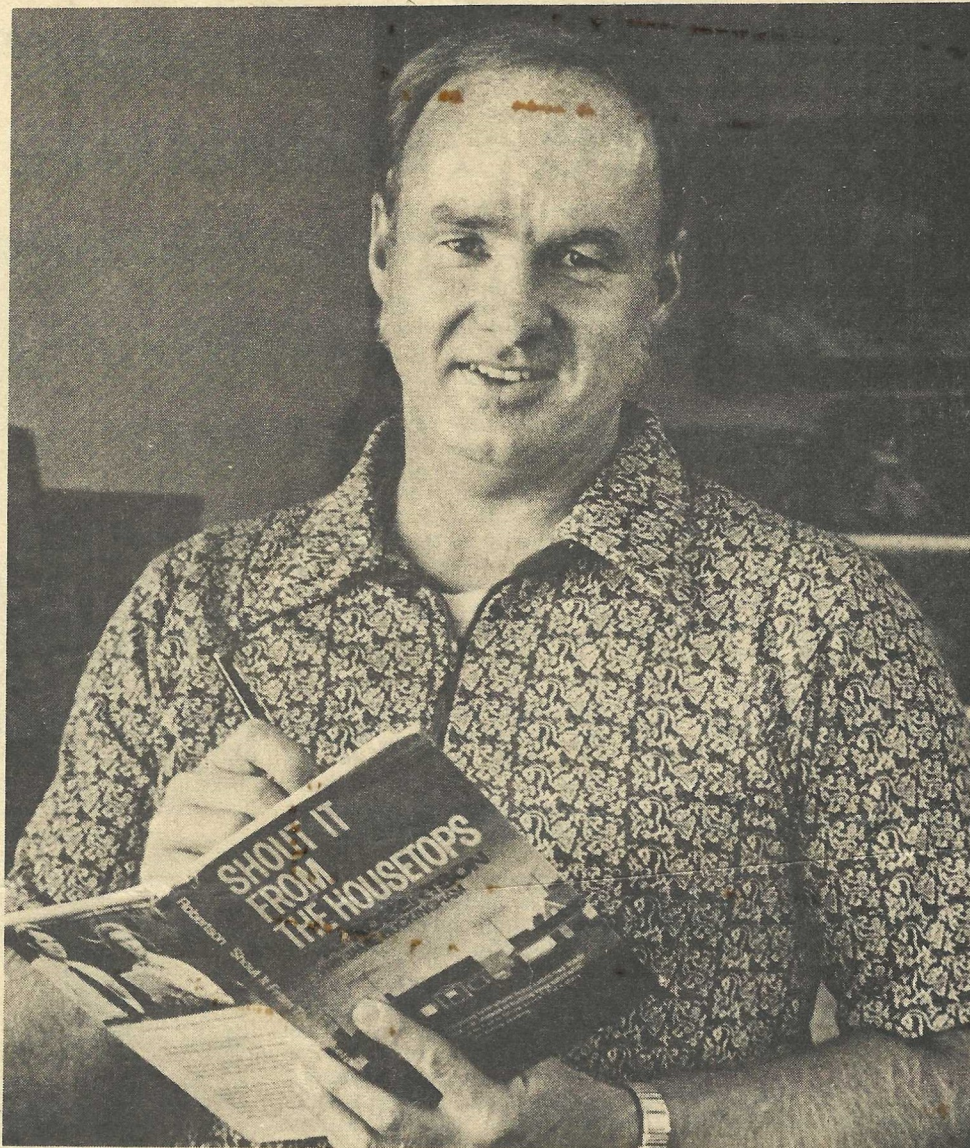
He penned "God Can Do It Again" for Kathryn Kuhlman, "Ben Israel" and other books plus numerous magazine articles.
